Smyrna's Friendship house will be hosting a twice monthly parenting/ caregiving for today's children meet-up and support group. Join us the 1st and 3rd Tuesday of EVERY month starting January 3rd, 2017. Meet-ups will take place from 6-8 PM and include a lite supper. The topics of the classes will be most suited for first-time expectant parents (whether they choose to raise their child or place their child for adoption), through parents of preschool aged children.

On the 1st Tuesday of each month we invite the expectant mother or the individual that is or will become the primary care-giver for the child. The 3rd Tuesday of each month we invite the support system of the primary caregiver to attend as well. The separation of attendance will allow the primary care-giver a safe space to learn, grow, and ask questions about the various topics that will be presented. The class in which we invite the support system to attend, will be a time to implore the primary care giver to educate about the topic and communicate how they need support to obtain desired goals.
