### Dear Friends,



The Christian church has a long history of imagery of God as "father." This imagery gives us a whole different set of ideas about God than does imagery of God as "mother." It has been reflected in our theology over the years (and Brian Wren does a great job showing some of those images in his hymn, "Bring Many Names." For example, one stereotypical male image is God as a strong, conquering hero – the type of God that encouraged the conquest that we find in the first five books of the Bible, which lingered into the way we settled our own country (among others.) There is, however, much other imagery of God in the Bible, which shows us other ways of approaching care of Creation – our neighbors, the animals, and the earth.

To be sure, even gender roles are not uniform in the Bible, because Jesus, a man, talks about longing to gather the people of Jerusalem like a hen gathering her chicks. He reminds us that we are all in this together, and

that we need to nurture relationships, and take care of the earth – the plants, the animals, the water, the soil, the atmosphere, the climate.

Jesus's father was a carpenter, and just like a good carpenter would take good care of his (or her tools) in order to do their work, so are we called to take good care of the tools God gave us – the manifold gifts of this good earth.

May God – our father and mother in all the rich and full connotations these roles connote – and more – bless you and keep you, now and always.

Smyrna United Church of Christ is now set up to be one of those charities. It will ask you to choose a charity the first time, then will automatically donate to that charity unless you make a change.






The old oak tree that stood at the entrance to Smyrna's parking lot for as long as anyone can remember was removed last fall.

As it was in poor health and being attacked by borers, we determined that it would be a safety hazard if left any longer.



tree's age to be about 130 years, which would mean it was an acorn or a seedling when the land was being cleared for the building of the Church. The diameter of the trunk was 1 inch at 3 years, 2 feet at 50 yrs., and 4 feet at 130 yrs. Borer tunnels (borers are the grub stage of wood beetles) and rotted wood can be seen in the outer edges of the trunk in this sample.
