#### Mission and Outreach:

The total that was sent to Quilts for Empowerment was \$1067.48. Our donation enabled them to qualify for a matching grant that brought their fundraising to \$30,000.

Children for Change and the coffee fund continues to support the Molalla Service Center and the Canby Food Bank. A thousand dollars was sent for Thanksgiving and another thousand dollars will be sent before Christmas.

We received a request for help from the Molalla Warming Center. This year they have moved to the Nazarene Church gym where they have access to showers. Women's Fellowship has sent \$100. for shower gel, shampoo, and other supplies.

\$308.25 was sent to the UCC for Oregon Fire Relief.
