PASTORAL

SEARCH COMMITTEE just before the Christmas holiday period.

The Pastoral Search Committee was formed in October and members approved by a special congregational meeting after Pastor Deb informed us of her resignation from Smyrna UCC. In 2021 the committee held two Zoom meetings with the conference pastor Tyler Connoley.

Based on those discussions, the committee prepared a "Position Posting" for an Intentional Interim transition pastor, three-fourths time, to guide us through developing a congregational profile and defining our needs to call the next settled pastor. The conference put the interim pastor posting on the national UCC ministerial jobs web site December 20, 2021, just before the Christmas holiday period.

Any applicant will respond to the conference, who will validate the candidate before forwarding their application to the committee. We have (as of January 22) received two applications. The committee will be operating under a requirement to maintain confidentiality of all candidates' personal information, so will not be able to give much detail as the process goes forward. A "typical" search for an Intentional Interim pastor would take about six months, but could vary widely. An Intentional Interim pastoral call typically lasts one to two years, and can also vary widely. Our posting specifies up to 15 months, with an option to extend to 20 months total.





If you feel moved to write a review, it would be welcome but it is not necessary.


I'll start:

Emergency Preparedness

Good emergency equipment for vehicles includes snow tires or chains and emergency supplies including:

- 1. Extra gas
- 2. Blankets
- 3. Shovel
- 4. Water (one gallon per person per day for several days, for drinking and sanitation)
- 5. Food (at least a three-day supply of non-perishable food0
- 6. Battery-powered or hand-crank radio and a NOAA Weather Radio with tone alert
- 7. Flashlight
- First aid kit
- 9. Extra batteries
- 10. Whistle (to signal for help)
- 11. Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties (for personal sanitation)
- 12. Wrench or pliers (to turn off utilities)
- 13. Manual can opener (for food)
- 14. Local maps
- 15. Cell phone with chargers and a backup battery



Emergency tip: Instead of stockpiling an emergency food supply that expires, consider purchasing a dehydrated one. I purchased one at Costco that contains 124 servings, has a 25 year shelf life, and comes in a bucket with a handle for carrying. \$59.99
