
Here's to a good year of reflecting the sacred in all we do. God's peace and power be with you.

Mary, a Guide Dogs For the Blind volunteer, introduced us to Jones and explained the many services she and Jones perform for them. Mary has been a volunteer in several capacities in the years since her retirement from teaching and was fortunate to be able to rescue Jones when he was unable to continue with guide dog training. Or maybe it would be more appropriate to say that Jones was fortunate to have Mary available to adopt him.

Mary spoke to us about the many services the dogs provide to those who are blind or those who have very limited sight. There is intensive training that both the recipients and the dogs must complete. The best part is that the services, including transportation, housing and care are all completely provided at no cost.

And that is where we come in. We have chosen Guide Dogs For the Blind as our Children For Change recipient for January and February.





IN CASE OF EMERGENCY

Winter Auto Emergency Kit Recommendations

- Mobile phone with important phone numbers, including personal emergency contacts, family members and emergency services; *be sure to include an extra charger or power storage device.*
- Drinking water or electrolyte-replenishing sports drinks (they have a slightly lower freezing temperature)
- First aid kit, including extra doses of whatever medications are needed by you and your family members in addition to any traveling pets.
- Non-perishable snacks for both human and pet passengers
- Bag of abrasive material (sand, salt, cat litter) or traction
 mats
- Snow shovel
- Blankets or sleeping bag
- Additional pieces of warm clothing (gloves, hats, scarves)
- Flashlight in addition to extra batteries
- Extra window washer fluid
- Ice scraper with brush
- Rags or roll of paper towels
- Jumper cables, cleaned and recently checked
- Warning devices (flares or reflective hazard signs)
- Basic household tool kit (for instance, screwdrivers, pliers, adjustable wrench, small hammer, electrical or duct tape)
