I thank my God for every remembrance of you, always in every one of my prayers for all of you, praying with joy for your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now. Philippians 1:3-5

You are so lovely; I trust it will be easy to find a bridge pastor who will minster to you until your new settled Pastor arrives. In the meantime, we get to enjoy the time we have left together! Pastor Janet and I are excited to help you get ready to receive your new Pastor.

Keep shining the bright light of your faithful witness of a God whose love is all-inclusive and you will attract a pastor (and more friends!) who want to be part of a Christian community that "loves in public" those who are marginalized.\*


### Save the date:

### Learning from the Happiest Country in the World

The World Happiness Report asks people in 156 countries to rate their lives on a scale of 0 to 10, with the worst possible life as a 0. It also looks at factors that contribute to social support, life expectancy, generosity, and absence of corruption. For five years in a row, Finland has topped the list as the happiest country in the world.

Here are some things the Finns avoid:

- 1. They don't compare themselves to their neighbors, especially in financial terms. They tend to focus on what makes them happy rather than looking successful.
- 2. They don't overlook the benefits of nature. Many Finns use their four weeks of summer vacation to go to the country-side in the midst of nature. There are also numerous parks available in the cities.

. They don't break the community circle of trust. They tend to trust each other and value honesty. If someone loses a wallet or a phone, they will nearly always get it back. Children often take a public bus home from school and play outside without supervision.

Even if we don't live in Finland, we can follow their example to try to improve our own happiness and our society: Don't try to keep up with the



Joneses. Spend time outdoors in the midst of nature. Try to become trustworthy and to trust those around you. Spend some time in Finland if you can.



### The Communion Tablecloth

Closing a church brings up many questions, not the least of which is, "what to do with the objects which are precious to the congregation?"

To me the best answer is to donate them to another congregation. Thus, the new cloth you may have noticed on the Communion table on Easter.



New books in the church library:

Change Your Questions Change Your Life, 2d ed. by Marilee Adams. This book was mentioned in a recent sermon. It's a quick read, told in story form, about Ben the "Answer Man" who is sinking fast at work and home because of his failed search for the right answers. From a mentor he learns about Question Thinking and how to be a Learner instead of a Judger.

<u>Jesus is the Question: The 307 Questions Jesus Asked and the 3 He Answered</u> by Martin B. Copenhaver. The title of the book is attention-grabbing and continues the theme of questioning Why did Jesus ask so many questions? Are questions an important part of our spiritual growth?

How To Be An Antiracist by Ibram X. Kendi. Racial justice in the U.S. continues to be at the forefront of breaking news so the questions that this book title provokes are "Am I a racist?" and, if I am, "How do I become an antiracist?" Kendi, an academic historian, asks himself these questions as he looks back at his high school, college, and graduate school years and interweaves these memories with his knowledge of U.S. history.
