Watching the Magi bring their improvised gifts to the cradle, I gave thanks for the elves, who are not magical secret beings, but who are each one of you, bringing what you have and trusting that it will be just the thing to bring about the Reign of Christ right here, right now. Alzheimer's Disease and Ways of Reducing Risk

Alzheimer's disease affects about 6.5 million people in the U.S. It affects the parts of the brain that control thought, memory, and language. Beginning with mild memory loss, it is a progressive disease that can lead to the inability to recognize other people and respond to



the environment. It is not a normal part of aging, and scientists are working to understand the causes and develop treatments. There is evidence that healthy behaviors can lower the risk for

Alzheimer's. Here are some of them:

- 1. Prevent and manage high blood pressure.
- 2. Manage blood sugar to keep it in a normal range.
- 3. Maintain a healthy weight.
- 4. Be physically active.
- 5. Quit smoking.
- 6. Avoid excessive drinking.
- 7. Prevent and correct hearing loss.
- 8. Get enough sleep.

If you notice signs of memory loss in yourself or a loved one, it is a good idea to discuss it with the doctor. Anyone who is on Medicare is eligible for a yearly "wellness exam," which is basically a screening for dementia and depression. Changes over time can help track the progression of Alzheimer's, if present...
