Dear Smyrna Friends,

February brings us the first couple weeks of the season of Lent, the 40 days before Easter during which we are invited to draw closer to God and God's will for us. You may have been a part of a faith tradition in which you were encouraged to "give something up" during Lent. And certainly, if you feel that it brings you closer to God, you are welcome to give it a try. (Ask me sometime about the Lent in my young adulthood when I tried to give up feeling sorry for myself. It was...informative!)

During this season, you might also want to think about taking something on — some new prayer practice or activity that will help you feel God's presence more acutely. If worship and learning with your community is something you'd like to take on, there are a couple of opportunities this season.

Prayer in community will bookend the Lenten season. Our Ash Wednesday Service (on Wednesday, February 14 at 4:00 pm) will be a simple reminder of how our bodies and souls are connected to one another and to the Divine. At the end of Lent, a Good Friday Vigil (March 29, drop in anytime from 12-3pm) will provide another opportunity for prayer and contemplation before Easter Sunday (March 31).

And on Wednesdays in Lent (February 21 and 28 and March 6, 13, and 20) we will have an evening study. Similar to our Advent study, we will watch a short video and then have time for reflection and conversation. We'll be drawing from the series Marching from Pain to Possibility: A Film Series on the Journey from Woundedness to Wholeness. Unlike our Advent study which featured one speaker, this series will feature a variety of voices.

The Work of People which produced the series, has the following to say about the series.

"Pain proposes perplexing questions: What is the meaning of pain? How can I survive it? What do I do with it? However, Lent offers a way of grappling with the unintelligibility of pain; it invites us to look at our lives and our deepest longings for healing, restoration, and fulfillment.

These films are invitations to enter into a journey of making sense of our deepest desires that comes from pain and woundedness. The curriculum that follows each film offers ways to reflect and find that place of pain, and at the same time, that place of wholeness and healing. Practices will be suggested as invitations to examine both our wounds and the wounds of others and see how we might bring peace and healing. The desert is a place void of easy fixes, but it can also be where we find who we truly are."

I look forward to continuing to explore God's work in our community with you all. See you in church!



Heimlich maneuver on self

The Heimlich maneuver is a first aid procedure used when a person is choking. If you are alone and you are choking, you can try to dislodge the item in your throat or windpipe by performing the Heimlich maneuver on yourself.



Place fist above navel while grasping fist with other hand,

Leaning over a chair or countertop, drive your fist towards yourself with an upward thrust.

Information

When you are choking, your airway may be blocked so that not enough oxygen reaches the lungs. Without oxygen, brain damage can occur in as little as 4 to 6 minutes. Rapid first aid for choking can save your life.

If you are choking on something, you can perform the Heimlich maneuver on yourself. Follow these steps:

- Make a fist with one hand. Place the thumb of that hand below your rib cage and above your navel.
- Grasp your fist with your other hand. Press your fist forcibly into the upper abdominal area with a quick upward movement.

You can also lean over a table edge, chair, or railing. Quickly thrust your upper belly area (upper abdomen) against the edge.

If you need to, repeat this motion until the object blocking your airway comes out.
