It's the beginning of autumn and time to think of the

traditional autumn ritual: getting your immunizations.

- The latest COVID booster is available, as is the latest flu shot.
- There is also a relatively new immunization for RSV, another respiratory virus which can be especially dangerous for infants and senior citizens. (You do not need an RSV shot every year, which may be some consolation.)
- If you have ever had chicken pox, you are at risk for developing shingles. Guess what? There's another vaccine for that (also not a yearly shot).
- You can usually get more than one vaccine on the same day, but some people are more apt to get very sore arms than others. Having two sore arms at the same time is not fun. You may not be able to raise your clean plates to the cupboard shelves for a few days. Think back to the last time you had a vaccination to gauge whether or not you are apt to have the dreaded sorearm-syndrome, and make your decision accordingly.

If you are tired of hearing about vaccines, remember that these diseases still manage to kill people every year..

And remember that by getting a vaccination you are helping to protect not only yourself but your loved ones and the strangers you pass by in the grocery aisles.
