

We will again be celebrating **"Sock It To Me Sunday."** Please bring socks for children or adults that will be delivered to those in need.



The council approved at its May meeting to accept the recommendation of the Mission and Outreach Committee. Three charities will receive \$500. each.

- 1. The local Habitat for Humanity
- 2. Palestinian YWCA
- 3. Church World Service for disaster relief in Puerto Rico

This money will come from the Oktoberfest Fund.

Thank you also for continued support of "Children for Change." Together with a donation from Stitch Club, money has been sent to purchase blankets for immediate response to emergencies. During the summer months, "Children for Change" money will go to KIVA. This is a micro lending organization of which Smyrna has a lending team. At this time our group has 27 members who have made 266 small loans totaling \$6,600. To learn more, go to KIVA.org. Loans can be as small as \$25.00 and when they are repaid, the money can be lent to someone else.
