
“I will bless you. So that you will be a blessing.” —Gen. 12:2



Once you've finished your coloring sheet and have written your word of blessing on it, take a photo of it and share on social media with the hashtag #BlessTheCPCUCC





celebrating the peace of Christ, the gift of the Holy Spirit, and God's inclusive love.




