### **Meet Pastor Catherine "Cat" Allard**

Pastor Cat is excited to provide worship leadership and pastoral support for Smryna UCC through June 2021 while our Pastor Deb is serving in the Oregon State Legislature.

Cat moved to Oregon from New Hampshire in 2016 for her first sole Pastorate. Prior to her ordination in 2016, Cat served in a variety of church staff positions in New England congregational churches - in both urban/big city and rural/small town communities. She currently serves on the Disaster Ministries and Local Church / Education Ministries Teams for the UCC Central Pacific Conference, as well as on the Ecumenical Ministries of Oregon (EMO) Board of Directors.

Her call is deeply rooted in her own experience of "new life in Christ;" which was made possible by the open and affirming theology of the United Church of Christ. Cat's most persistent calling, which preceded her call to ordained ministry, is Anti-Racism work. The more she learned about Jesus, the more she found those two calls were divinely aligned.

Current expressions of her commitment to Anti-Racism work include her involvement with the Common Table's Reckoning with Oregon's Racist History Learning Cohort Journey, and as a founding member of the Wilsonville Alliance for Inclusive Community. Cat lives in Wilsonville with her partner Jill, who is a middle school math teacher and 2nd year seminarian at the Claremont School of Theology.


