## Dear Smyrna friends,

Thank you for the warm reception I've received! It has been a blessing to begin to get to know you, and to have the privilege of preparing worship with and for you each week. As I write this, the Lenten season has just begun.

It started during the aftermath of an ice storm that led to power outages for many, if not most, of our church members. Between generators, and friends and family who opened their homes to loved ones without power, it seems folks have been able to make do with what they have, and with what they don't. Experiences like these tend to help us realize something about ourselves, our lifestyles, our strengths and weaknesses, our neighbors / community — and how connected we are or not (or could be!). They can even turn our attention, more intentionally, to God (how Lenten!).

The storm's damage to our tree friends has been heartbreaking to see (for the trees' sake), and for many property owners — a real mess to cleanup. It has been heartwarming to see both the way Smyrna UCC community members have expressed concern for each other, as well as for the property, with acts of service and kindness.

Throughout the long month of March, which will mark the one-year anniversary of worshiping virtually, we will continue "seeking God" in this wilderness time that has stretched well beyond 40 days. What better time than right now, to try out (one week at a time) the six spiritual practices Beth Richardson invites us into?

As we practice Being Present, Lament, *Lectio Divina*, Trust, Compassion, and Hospitality, may we deepen our relationship with the Holy – beyond us, within us, and among us. And may these practices, and this deepening help sustain us for the while longer we'll be worshiping online.

As daylight hours lengthen, we give thanks for more light. As more of our community members get vaccinated, we give thanks for their protection. As we walk with Jesus to Jerusalem, we give thanks for all he teaches us along the way. For every reminder that the Love we're born from and return to, is the same Love that abides in us and with us every day – we give thanks! Amen.
