Dear folks,

This year, the Mission and Outreach team has decided to dedicate themselves to the theme of immigration and are inviting the congregation to experiences of learning, service, prayer and protest that will help us better understand this issue.

As followers of Christ, we believe that all people are made in the image of God, and deserve dignity, compassion, and protection. We remember that Jesus himself was a refugee, who was forced to flee the country just after he was born, because his life was in danger. Again and again, scripture calls us to welcome the stranger, care for the marginalized, and seek justice for the oppressed. So, we are doing what we can here at Smyrna to live out this call, which is not a political issue but faith and humanitarian one.



Here's one example. One Thursday in September, Janet Bess and I attended a protest against inhumane and illegal deportations. Along with 200 others, we gathered at the ICE building in Portland to pray, sing and learn. In order to leave a memory of the more than 100 people from Oregon who have been deported since June, we wrote their initials in chalk. It was a beautiful, sunny day and we also had a chance to have a conversation with some of the protesters who had been camping there. It was a beautiful day, but one difficult part of our time there was being impacted by tear gas and other chemical remnants that cover the ground around the building - we were sneezing and experienced watery eyes and tingly mouths just from being near where tear gas had been. It was a reminder of the terror that those who regularly protest are undergoing, and made us more determined than ever to continue to add our witness to theirs.

Looking ahead, I would like to invite you to join Ginger Redlinger and I (and hopefully others from our church and conference!) for a weekend of learning at Good Shepherd United Church of Christ in Sahuarita Arizona from JANUARY 15 -17, 2026. This yearly event is called Common Ground from the Border.

This year's theme is "Changes in a Changeless Desert: A celebration of commitment, compassion, and community across the US/Mexico borderlands."

The United States-Mexico borderlands has always been a beautiful mix of culture, language, cuisine, economies, and people. It has also been a place of struggle, high and low temperatures, a fragile environment, and the push and pull of immigration.

The Borderlands is the perfect place to explore the arts, touch the culture, and have deeper conversations about the complicated issues that collide here. We hope you will come and explore with us all the possibilities.

Thursday is a day of engaging field trips to immerse ourselves in the culture, life, and issues along the US/Mexico border. Then there will be an evening film screening of the documentary film, "Samaritans", by David Damian Figueroa. On Friday we will have keynote addresses in the morning, classes in the afternoon, and a great dinner followed by an evening with Dr. Kathy Bullock leading us in a musical journey of gospel music and spirituals. On Saturday we will have keynote addresses and a festival in the morning, classes in the afternoon and another great dinner followed by an evening exclusive documentary film, "Ugly Little Monkeys" — The story of the world-renowned mariachi youth group, "Los Changuitos Feos," and a concert by Los Changuitos Feos.

I plan to travel to Arizona on Wednesday, January 14 and stay through worship at Good Shepherd UCC on Sunday, January 18th. Registration for this event begins on October 15th. Please let me know if you are interested in joining us for this powerful and transformative experience. Flu and Covid Vaccinations

September and October are generally considered to be the best months to get vaccinated against flu and COVID. The latest flu vaccine is ready and waiting, so feel free to go in to your local pharmacy or doctor's office and get it.

The COVID vaccine, however, has had a tumultuous and uncertain time of it, due to the new Department of Health and Human Services and its change in personnel and attitude toward vaccines. The FDA imposed restrictions on which people were approved for the vaccine; others outside of the approved groups could still try to get it but might have difficulty trying to get a doctor's prescription or might have to pay for it out of pocket.

Various medical groups, such as the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists and the American Academy of Pediatrics, disagreed with the FDA and issued their own recommendations. Individual states have taken action to increase access to the new COVID vaccine by giving pharmacists the okay to give vaccines without doctors' prescriptions.

California, Oregon, Washington, and Hawaii have formed a health alliance which issues its own recommendations designed to keep vaccine policy rooted in science rather than politics. It is guided by recommendations from major medical groups, including the American Academy of Pediatrics, the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists, and the American Academy of Family Physicians.

So, any adult Oregonian may receive the COVID vaccine without a prescription. Children over 6 months of age are also recommended to receive the vaccine, although children under 7 years old must go to a doctor's office or clinic to get it. Most state-regulated health insurance plans must cover the vaccine without copays. If you are unsure if you are covered by insurance, ask the provider who administers the vaccine.

Now is the time to get both the flu and the COVID vaccines if you have not done so already. Have a happy and disease-free fall and winter season



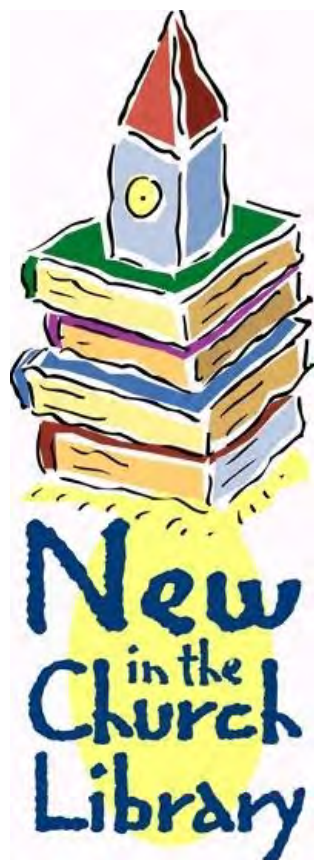
New Books in the Smyrna Library

Help Thanks Wow: The Three Essential Prayers by Anne Lamott. Lamott writes "I do not know much about God and prayer, but I have come to believe, over the last twenty-five years, that there's something to be said about keeping prayer simple. Help. Thanks. Wow." Less than 100 pages long, this book provided a reading at Smyrna's "Art and Soul" first session and is considered a treasure by Lamott fans.

How We Learn To Be Brave: Decisive Moments in Life and Faith by Mariann Edgar Budde.

Decisive moments— to go, to stay, to start, to accept what we didn't choose and to step up to moments that come unexpectedly-- are universal while particular to each of us. Budde shares how to learn to live and respond on the journey called "being brave" in ways that align with readers' best selves.

I Seek A Kind Person by Julian Borger "unearths the astonishing journeys of Jewish children at the hands of fate" in 1938 Vienna. Desperate parents take out advertisements offering their children into the safekeeping of readers of a British newspaper, the Manchester Guardian. Eighty-three years later, Guardian journalist Julian Borger comes across the ad that saved his father, Robert, from the Nazis and begins to investigate this family secret and the stories of other children like Robert and their families.
